	I have received an email that the school is closed and that I need to send my bank details so I can receive FSM funds. Should I do this?	<b>No, this is a scam. Do not do this. We have not been advised to close, school is still open for specific pupils and pupils of keyworkers. All communications will come from school.</b>
<b>U</b>	Are there any special regulations for schools in force at the moment?	Yes, you will have heard that the school will only be open for keyworkers, pupils with care plans and assigned a social worker. The school are following Public Health England and DfE guidance. <b>We are however operating on the Trust risk assessment level 2. This risk assessment is currently being reviewed.</b>
<b>U</b>	I am a keyworker, can my child come to school?	The school will be open for your child subject to confirmation that your work is in the keyworker list as provided by the Government. Your child can only attend on days that you are working. We need to operate a tier system and also limit pupils to 20% of school capacity. This may become more difficult with the Government's decision to ask schools to take more pupils. Keyworker children will remain a priority.
<b>U</b>	What is the school doing about Coronavirus?	The schools are following Public Health England and DfE advice. At this moment there is no special arrangements required (except extra hand washing). We are currently making arrangements to put in place all the guidance from the Government. Schools remain fully open for certain pupils and that of key workers. This is currently under review and we are awaiting Trustees decision.

What will we do about SAT's?

These have been cancelled but we will continue to work on improving pupils in this area.

I want to keep my child at home, can I do this?

From 23<sup>rd</sup> March, **you should keep your child at home** unless you are a keyworker as dictated by the Government or have a child on an EHCP or associated with a social worker.

How do I know that the school staff do not have the virus?

Our staff are professionals and anyone that shows symptoms will self-isolate and in this unlikely case, we will re-evaluate the situation.

**U** What happens during the May half Term holidays?

We will continue to be open (except Bank Holiday Monday) in our current operational model.

Will the Summer holidays be cancelled, or will there be a change in the school working year?

It is unlikely that this will change. We will need to follow DfE instructions and will keep you updated.

What about PTA functions, are they still allowed?

All these should be cancelled forthwith.

**U** What extra cleaning is the school doing?

Normal cleaning is still in operation. Particular attention though is being paid to handles, banisters and iPad screens. An updated cleaning regime will be in place before further pupils are admitted to school.

If the school is closed because of a coronavirus case, will you do a deep clean?

This will be assessed at the time. A deep clean may be required if any of our pupils or staff have symptoms. It is unlikely to be required if closure is a part of a general nationwide instruction.

What happens if teachers are off due to the virus or self-isolation?

We are planning to ensure we have sufficient staff cover at all times.

Do I need to keep my children away from school?

Yes, from the 23<sup>rd</sup> March unless you or your child falls into the excluded category; Keyworker, EHCP or assigned Social Worker.

What can I do to help?

Follow all Public Health England advice. Encourage and instruct your children and other family members to periodically and vigorously wash hands. Teachers will also instruct pupils within school.

**U** What about Pre-School?

From 23<sup>rd</sup> March school run Pre-schools will only be available for designated keyworker staff and pupils on EHCP's or assigned a social worker. Government requirements to open Pre-Schools are currently being considered by the Trustees.

What about lettings?

Lettings for non-pupil benefit are to be cancelled from Friday 20/3/20. Lettings for pupils benefit such as After School and Breakfast Clubs will continue for the time being although they have been advised that they are likely to be cancelled in the near future.

**U** Breakfast Clubs and After School Clubs.

3<sup>rd</sup> party providers are closed until further notice. There are no plans at the moment for TRAT provision when increased (R,Y1,Y6) provision commences, although there may be some limited provision at Grange.

I have a child at another school that has been sent home. Do I need to self-isolate my other children at TRAT schools?

Current NHS guidelines say this is a mandatory 14 day self-isolation.

If the school closes, how will I know when it reopens?

We will send texts but please also monitor the school website. Staff should monitor the Trust website [www.robinswoodtrust.co.uk](http://www.robinswoodtrust.co.uk) and their school email account.

**U** If the school closes what happens about the planned inset days?

Inset days for the current year are now completed. Currently the inset day on the 1<sup>st</sup> September is still planned to happen.

What is happening with sports fixtures and visiting other schools?

All external sports fixtures and visiting other schools are cancelled from 17/3/20.

What about your kitchen operations?

All our kitchens have an excellent hygiene regime. All are rated 5\* from the environmental agency. This level of hygiene will continue. A number of our kitchens will remain open to provide packed lunches for FSM pupils.

My child is in the group that still needs to attend school. Will he/she/them be provided with a lunch?

We are providing a free pack lunch (or hot meal, depending on catering facilities and staff availability) for all pupils that attend school whether FSM or not. It is also planned to provide free packs lunches, hampers or vouchers for non-attending FSM pupils. These will be collected from a local school (it may not be your normal school). Actual provision will depend on the local school and the availability. The Government FSM Voucher scheme has been announced and we are awaiting ordering details.
